### OFA Eye Exams

### Additional Information - Please Read:

The Canine Eye Registration Foundation (CERF) was the only registry for screening eye examinations until recently when a second registry was established through the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA). The eye examination performed is the same for either registry as are the criteria for pass or fail, but the forms to be completed and submitted are different. The American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists (ACVO) has endorsed the OFA registry in preference to CERF. Therefore, most ophthalmologists will provide OFA registry forms unless the pet owner specifically requests a CERF form. Both forms will be available at the eye clinic, but there will be a \$2.00 surcharge for each CERF form requested. The cost of the OFA form is included in the examination fee.

Eye exams will be offered by Dr. B. Keith Collins from Eye Care for Animals, a Board Certified Ophthalmologist from Pewaukee, WI. The exam times will start at approximately 1:30 p.m. on Friday, May 10, 2013, following the Dog and Bitch classes.

We are required to have a minimum of 30 dogs. This will be open to all breeds with Belgian sheepdogs having preference. We will have a sign-up sheet which you <u>must</u> sign whether or not you have pre-entered. Pre-entering does reserve you a slot but not a time. The sign-in sheet will determine your appointment time. You may pick from what is available. If you are not there at your time slot time, you will be moved to follow the last person signed in. If the clinic is filled, we will not take walk-ins. The exam fee is \$30.00. Be sure to have each dog's AKC number at time of exam.

NOTE: Clinic will be canceled if 30 reservations not received by April 10. All checks will be returned in the event of cancellation. If you cancel your reservation(s) before April 10, you will receive a refund and the next person on the waiting list will be notified.

### <u>Clothing</u>

We will be taking pre-orders for 2013 Specialty Clothing. Please go to <u>bsca2013.bsca.info</u> and check out the available clothing for this years specialty. Clothing orders are very difficult to predict and many specialties have ended up with lots of leftover items which are a substantial loss to the club. We will attempt to keep our stock at the Specialty to a minimum so please pre-order.

There will be a limited time frame for pre-orders so we can be sure to have your items shipped to you before the Specialty.

The cut off for ordering clothing is April 6, 2013. This is a FIRM date. If you require an Extra small, Small size or a XXL or above size you MUST order before this date. Extra small (XS), Small and extra large sizes (XXL and up) will only be availabe through pre-orders.

Limited quantities of clothing will be available but our Embroiderer will have a booth at our site and will take orders for any items and any size requested.

### Seminars

This year we have several seminars planned.

### **Tracking Mini Workshop**

Following the Tracking test there will be a mini workshop offered by Vincent Ramirez, BSCA member and AKC tracking Judge. There will be only 5 working spots offered and unlimited auditing spots. Vincent has provided a Questionnaire (visit Seminars page on BSCA Specialty web site to complete the form online) that you must return to him if you are interested in filling one of these 5 spots. He will then choose the participants to fill the spots based on the information provided.

An additional \$10 will be charged for those chosen for the Working spot at this Mini Workshop. The Auditing portion of this Mini clinic is open to non-Belgian Sheepdog owners.

The questionnaire is available on the BSCA Specialty web site under Seminars. It will be available for online completion and will be automatically e-mailed to Vincent Ramirez. It must be received by the event closing date of April 10.

From Vincent Ramirez -

Mini Tracking Workshop

I want handlers and their canine companions to experience the positive of tracking. Tracking builds trust in the dog, tracking builds the dog's confidence and it gives the handler another opportunity to place their hands on the dog with praise. I am comfortable teaching elder retired obedience dogs and young puppies alike. My first tracking dog and I were just looking for something to do after years of competitive obedience. Belgian Sheepdog Turbo UD TDX was the perfect instructor passing his TDX just 10 months after his TD at 13.5 years of age. I treasure that time spent working scent with Turbo and have with each dog since. My second tracking dog was started young to become a Champion Tracker June 25, 2000. CT Twister and I stepped away from AKC for the next four years training with USAR NETF-1. With Twister at my side we completed the FEMA USAR Canine Search Specialist Course at Camp Murray, WA September 14, 2001. Training with top SAR handlers and their dogs in difficult if not hostile environments, gave me a welcomed perspective of training in drive and teaching with motivation.

Next were Belgian Tervurens CH CT CoCo Puff, CH OTCH CT Amy and recently CH CT Danya and CH CT Bragger UD. I am currently working two Tervuren in TD/TDX and one Belgian Sheepdog in VST. To date six TD's, seven TDX's, and five VST's / Champion Trackers. I love these dogs and respect their abilities. These titles are theirs not mine.

The TD/TDX method that I use with my dogs is the same that I use for VST. At this mini workshop I look forward to working with fellow Belgian tracking teams problem solving tracking issues. Please note that this is not a full length tracking seminar, just a one afternoon mini workshop.

*Five teams will be given brief oversight, unlimited auditors. You are encouraged to bring a notebook, pen/pencil, a chair, crate, tracking harness, tracking line, tracking articles,* 

training treats, tracking flags. Prepare for weather. Show up with an open mind, negative energy not allowed.
